### A. Future hosts of AAC:

The Board confirmed the future hosts from 2022 to 2026. The IAK would like to withdraw from hosting the 2024 AAC and moved to 2027. IAI has expressed interest to host 2024 AAC.

- 2023 Philippines (moved)
- 2024 TBC
- 2025 Thailand (in conjunction with 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary)
- 2026 Singapore (in conjunction with 50th anniversary)

#### ACTION:

- ▶ The list of the hosts of past conference since 1981 will be distributed to the Board (see last page).
- ▶ Each association will decide whether they are interested to host the 2024 AAC and email the Board 30 June 2022. If there are multiple candidates, there will be a selection process to decide the host for 2027.

## B. Action points from 2019 AACECB meeting

1) Discussion and coordination of website development:

IAAust commented that the conference website usually hosted by the event vendor. Hence, the website discontinuity is a common issue. IAAust suggested to create a AAC landing page / microsite at the Actuaries Institute website, which allow a permanent location to present the AAC branding and background. Moreover, this enables re-directing to individual association and past AAC conferences.

ASHK commented that a landing page is straight forward and enable continuity, but budget and maintenance need to be considered.

SAS commented that further consideration is required on archiving such as Constitution and meeting minutes.

#### **ACTION:**

▶ As the host of the ICA2023, IAAust to start the pilot project to create the microsite for AAC before ICA2023. Majority of the Board supported this.

## 2) Review and update of the Constitution

SAS circulated the final version to the Board to seek pre-approval prior to the meeting. No further comments and questions were raised at the meeting.

## **ACTION:**

- ▶ The Board adopted the AsAA Constitution effective from 1 April 2022 and the latest version is amended to reflect the new appointment of IAJ President effective from 1 April 2022.
- ► Each association to sign the AsAA Constitution [file: AsAA Constitution effective 1 April 2022\_Final) and return to IAAust by 30 June 2022.

#### C. International Congress of Actuaries (ICA2023) Update

IAAust is hosting the ICA2023 from 28 May to 1 June 2023. The Institute is looking forward for the profession to get together in Sydney at ICA2023 and is looking into hosting meeting for the actuarial associations. The next host for ICA2026 is IAJ and the Asian hosts are making an impact on the profession. ICA2023 will be a hybrid event to cater for speakers and attendees who cannot attend the conference in person. President Annette King invites the Board to join the Global Ambassador program.
